Dear Parents & Carers

UPDATE – Coronavirus

Having considered activities in both schools over the next few weeks we have decided to make changes due to the Coronavirus. We have made this decision as we believe this is in the best interests of the children, staff and wider community.

Parents Evenings – We are cancelling the March Parents Evenings. Parents will be emailed their child's progress sheet on 24 March instead. If you have any **issues regarding your child's progress** that you would like to discuss with your class teacher, please email the enquiries email. You will receive an emailed response to your queries.

PTA – FEWS and FoSA meetings and activities have been cancelled until further notice. This includes the Disco at East Wold. A decision regarding the FEWS ball will be made at a later date.

Hockey – The hockey event has been cancelled for Thursday.

Celebration Worship – We will not be inviting parents, carers and visitors to worship until further notice.

Easter Church Services – We have cancelled the Easter Services for both schools.

Book Fair at East Wold – This event has been cancelled and will be rearranged in the future.

Easter Maths Morning at East Wold and Parent Open Events at North Cockerington – these events have been cancelled.

I would like to **urge all parents/carers not to gather at the entrance/on the playground at the beginning/end of the day**. You may wish to arrive at school in time for your child to walk straight into school. At the end of the day, gates will be locked promptly after the departure of the children.

As per my letter of last week, we would ask you to ensure that **if your child has a new, continuous cough OR a fever that you keep them at home for 7 days**. Follow Public Health England advice and 'do not leave your house for 7 days from when your symptoms started'. If after 7 days a fever is still present, please do not return to school until the fever has ceased. **If children in school are symptomatic, we will contact parents to collect their child.**



The current situation is that testing is not being undertaken in the community and therefore it is unlikely that we will know whether we have a confirmed case or not at our schools. I can assure you that we are following all government guidance and that hygiene regimes have been reviewed and enhanced. As per my letter of last week, hand washing is of highest priority at school.

At this difficult time, to help our community we would ask that everyone errs on the side of caution. We will support pupils self-isolating for 7 days and provide work for children unable to come to school.

Over the next few days we will ensure every child brings home an exercise book. Therefore, if the government announces that schools will close, or if children are needing to self-isolate, there is a book at home to record any learning. These books should not be returned to school but kept for home use.

Once again, thank you for your support at this challenging time.
